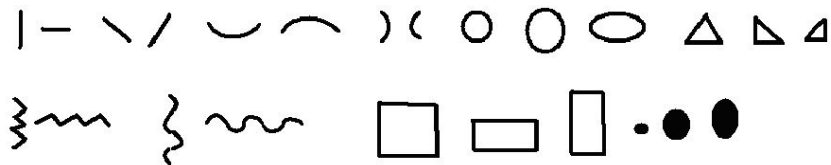

# Crabbetooms

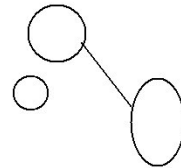
For the Crabbet Kids (or the child in all of us) we are going to offer this feature where you can learn to draw simple cartoons. Let's start with..... a horse of course. Actually, we will start with his head.

The first thing to remember is that drawing should be fun. All you need is a pencil, paper, eraser and fine tipped marker. Cartoons can't be right or wrong. Whatever you draw is fine. Drawing cartoons is as easy as drawing straight and curved lines and simple shapes then putting them all together. Here are all of the strokes you will need. Practice them a few times:

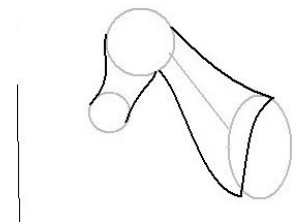


That's not so hard, is it? Let's start with a simple horse's head. It's like drawing a stick figure at first. (Please remember to use a pencil—you will erase a lot)

Step 1 – Start with three circles for the head and neck. <sup>1</sup>

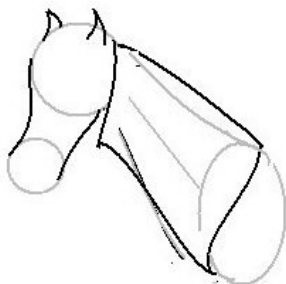


Step 2 – Add curved lines to connect the circle and outline the face and neck. <sup>2</sup>

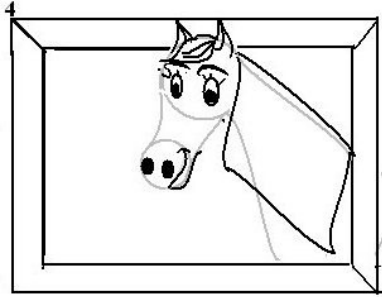


Step 3 – Add the ears and outline the mane. <sup>3</sup>

**Step 4 – Add the facial features (any way you want). The eyes can be big or small, open or shut and the mouth can be open, closed, smiling or frowning.**



**Step 5 – Finish it carefully and then trace the lines you want to keep with a marker, crayon, pen, or whatever you want and erase your pencil lines.**
